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Scope and Content:

The archivists for the Max R. Traurig Library have collected material regarding the industrialization and modernization of Waterbury. Documents span circa 1770 through 1984. Types of businesses include the Brass industry, the Button industry, the Clock industry, Taverns, Restaurants, and department stores. Documents and records of these

various companies are not expansive enough to merit their own collection, and therefore have been grouped together.
